



- The FLAIR Act Directs the Secretary of the Interior to develop a multipurpose cadastre of federal real property to assist with federal land management, resource conservation, environmental protection, and use of real property; authorizes the Secretary to enter into cost-sharing agreements with states.
- Ocean and Coastal Mapping Integration Act H.R. 365 and S. 174 - Legislation would direct the NOAA to coordinate federal ocean and coastal mapping and surveying activities with other federal efforts, international mapping activities, coastal states, user groups, and nongovernmental entities.
- AmericaView Geospatial Imagery Mapping Program Act

   Legislation would authorize a comprehensive national cooperative geospatial imagery mapping program through the United States Geological Survey, to promote use of the program for education, workforce training and development, and applied research, and to support Federal, State, tribal, and local government programs
- Association Health Plans The Small Business Health Fairness Act of 2009 (H.R. 2607 introduced by Rep. Sam Johnson) amends the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) to provide for establishment and governance of association health plans (AHPs).
- Agreement between ACSM and the BLM Agreement was signed on Sept. 2, 2008 for the following purposes: creation of a single point of contact for surveyors in the United States for knowledge and information about the Public land Survey System (PLSS) in support of

- critical national priorities; collect monies from various educational efforts to be used for the good of the profession; fund educational opportunities, scholarships and other training for the survey profession as it relates to PLSS issues; fund joint projects for research or special effort with other entities, including the BLM, as they relate to PLSS issues; publish additional BLM materials which are of interest to the private sector surveying community for which BLM has no budget to produce.
- Federal Land Survey Modernization With the federal appropriations process starting soon, it is an appropriate time to work for this funding again.

#### **BUSINESS:**

State Board for Engineers and Surveyors: Mr. Gene Dinkins, Chairman of the State Board of Professional Engineers and Surveyors, presented the current issues being discussed since our July board meeting. One of the main objectives this year is to keep good communications with the Board and surveyors across the state. Survey Coordinators – Board is looking into the legal aspects of submitting proposals. Mr. Dinkins reported that there is no one set person to handle the investigations for surveyors and engineers as in previous years. Suggestions and strides are being made to handle investigations thoroughly, fairly and timely. The Internal Review Committee (IRC) also helps to make final decisions in investigative matters. Mr. Rick Inman is the surveyor member

of this committee. The Board is working on a set formula for making fines uniform for engineers and surveyors. A Policy was made on length of time to keep survey records: Mandated by law, surveyors have to keep all plats and records for eight (8) years. Scanners are used with survey work and matters as a tool only. DHEC letter was received stating that as-built survey certification needed to be signed by an engineer. The Board took issue with the wording of the letter and will write a letter to DHEC asking them to reword the letter stating that an engineer is not allowed to sign an as-built survey. Board has certain funds that can be used for funding professional training and seminars. A new form will be available for use to request funds. Fundamentals of Surveying Exam: Applicants can take the FS exam at any time. No degree or experience is required at time of taking the exam. If passing the exam, the LSIT certificate will not be given until the education and experience requirements are met. There is no time limit to fulfill these requirements after taking the exam. Trig-Star - Mr. Dinkins informed SCSPLS group that some funding would be available to help fund the Trig-Star program. Contact Mr. Dinkins if you are interested in starting a Trig-Star program in any school in SC. Mr. Dinkins noted that in this bad economy, the Board is looking at making sure surveying work is legally done by a licensed surveyor, and requested that each surveyor keep the Board informed of any illegal work being done in the State. According to the standards, if the line is a property line, monumentation must be placed on a critical line of a plat. Recording of sketches: along with deeds: Staff Attorney of the State Board states that the Board cannot control what is recorded and anything can be recorded with the deed if it pertains to what is in the deed. New policy has been set on repeat application process. Applicants will have two (2) chances for submittal before the process has to start over and new fees will apply. Two Universities in SC have enough courses with emphasis on surveying to qualify for 18 semester hours in surveying which is required with a 4 year degree which meets the State's education requirement in order to take the PLS exam. Clemson University Forestry Department has a degree with survey emphasis which started in the fall semester. The Citadel has been approved and will be offering surveying classes with enough hours to qualify for educational requirements with a 4 year degree and taking the PLS exam. SC State wants to do a survey program in the Civil Engineering Department but will have to take the curriculum to the Commission on Higher Education to be approved. None of these courses will be ABET approved at present, and will not necessarily transfer to other state university surveying degrees. These two schools curriculums do meet the SC Board's educational requirements for taking the PLS exam. There is no 4 year program at USC at present. The SC Board is active on the national level with Mr. Dinkins and Mr. Henry Dingle as members of the National Examination for Professional Surveying Review Committee. Mr. Dinkins is pushing for a rewrite of the State Specific Survey Exam which is probably 20 years old at present. He requested help with writing the exam questions and asked for volunteers to contact President Moore, the SCSPLS office or Mr. Dinkins directly.

NCESS will meet with this committee to help them get the process started. Mr. Henry Dingle agreed to serve on this committee. Mr. Sid Shrum from Greenville Tech has agreed to participate on this committee as well. NSPS Schonstedt Donation: Mr. Henry Dingle, NSPS Governor, made a motion to donate two magnetic locators to the United Nations Mine Action Service. These will be used for locating leftover bombs in foreign countries which have not been detonated. Schonstedt will donate two matching locators. United Nations Mine Action will coordinate donations. Motion seconded by Mr. Burnett Jenkins. Board voted unanimously.

Nominating Committee Chairman: President Lewis Moore appointed Past President Lee Frank as the Chairman of the nomination Committee. Mr. Frank will select two others to be on this committee. Anyone interested in a position on the Executive Board or Districts 2, 4 and 6, should contact Mr. Frank. Nominations will be given on the floor of the March 27, 2010 Board and General Membership combined meeting. ETSU Request: East Tennessee State University has requested funding for their surveying and mapping program for 2010. Motion made by Mr. Lee Frank to donate \$500 to ETSU Foundation with a second by Ms. Frankie Manhardt. Board unanimously approved donation.

**NSPS Convention:** President Lewis Moore asked for an amendment to the budget for an additional \$1500 for travel for the Executive Secretary to go to the NSPS Annual Conference in Phoenix, Arizona. Motion coming from Executive Committee needing no second, was unanimously approved by the Board.

PLS Exam Requirements: Mr. Scott Barrett presented the dilemma of one of his employees, John Smith a student who met all the educational requirements for the June 30th deadline for requirements for taking the PLS but will not have completed the four years experience by two months. He was turned down by the State Board to take the test due to the lack of completed 4 year experience, which will now require him to have a 4 year degree instead of the two year degree requirement. The State board did make a ruling that the education requirement and experience had to be met by June 30, 2010, but the exam could be taken after the requirements were met. Experience does not have to start after the education requirement is met, but can be started at any time. Mr. Barrett explained the conflicting information given to Mr. Smith before he started his education. After a lengthy discussion and review of the facts, Mr. Barrett, asked for the Society's support with requesting to the State Board that Mr. Smith be able to take the PLS exam. Motion made by Mr. Henry Dingle that the Society not support this idea and that the law clearly has defined the June 30, 2010 date for many, many years. Motion was seconded. Motion approved not to support this request of Mr. Barrett.

**Lobbyist Report:** Mr. Joe Jones reported on a letter which was compiled by a number of organizations under the LLR organization. LLR has taken more and more responsibilities

away from many State Boards within LLR. So far, the Board of Professional Engineers and Surveyors does not fall into this category but many are concerned that this might happen in the future. He will be meeting with the Chairman of the LCI Committee to discuss issues facing LLR perhaps thru legislation. Mr. Jones requested that the SCSPLS board be a part of this initiative and to move forward. Motion made by Mr. Lee Frank to authorize Mr. Joe Jones to represent this Society to promote LLR reform as discussed in this report of 12/5/09. Motion with a second by Mr. Ben Christensen, passed unanimously. Mr. Jones also commented on strengthening qualification process for public offerings with no bidding process where he hopes to see legislation introduced in January as well as Tort Reform. Mr. Dinkins encouraged the society to support this initiative. The State Board needs each Society for support and/or fighting and moving legislation for your profession.

Foothills Chapter: Addition to report. Mr. Bobby
Foster commented that the Foothills Chapter will meet

interpretation which does not meet the requirements.



## Lobbyist Report South Carolina Society of Professional Land Surveyors

#### Joe S. Jones

#### The 2010 Session of the SC General Assembly is here.

The surveying and engineering communities have several issues this session: possible changes in the SC Department of Labor Licensing and Regulations, strengthening qualification based selection among political subdivisions and tort reform. However, their success may be tempered by the special situations surrounding this session. After discussing the legislation, I have given you my opinion about this session.

Lobbyists for several professional groups, including surveyors, engineers, pharmacists, accountants and realtors met prior to the session about concerns with the SC Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation. One of the meetings was with House Labor Commerce and Industry Chair, Representative Bill Sandifer. We are working with him to develop legislation that may address some of the concerns with the agency.

Most groups voiced concern with the new LLR division that is responsible for processing registration applications. Registrations for the SC State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors have not been placed under this new division yet, but other groups have, and they told horror stories about the foul-ups. I understand the engineering and surveying board's responsibilities will change in March, 2010, when its registrants will be processed by the new division.

Representative Sandifer suggested pulling a group of registration boards from under LLR and setting up a pilot program to see if the boards which are given independence perform better and more economically than under LLR. This legislation has not been written. I have petitioned Mr. Sandifer to allow the SC State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors to be a pilot board working outside LLR.

I am circulating language for a bill that would strengthen the qualification based selection process among political subdivisions. The legislation is fashioned after an existing law for architects. Hopefully, this bill will be finalized and introduced before the end of the month.

Tort reform is a major business issue this session. A Senate Judiciary Subcommittee has been meeting throughout the fall and into January on S.350 a comprehensive bill that affects all businesses, but one section is important to surveyors in particular because it deals with the statute of repose. Some attorneys are claiming a possible building code violation is gross negligence or recklessness and thus eliminates the limitation set by the statute of repose.

Among the potential big-money issues in this legislation is establishing reasonable limits on non economic damages and punitive damages. If a company is found to be at fault in a civil action where the company is fined those costs may be multiplied many fold if punitive and/or non economic damages are further imposed. This legislation seeks to put limits on these additional fines.

In all, there are 11 different issues addressed in the legislation. Hopefully, this legislation will pass this session.

Tort reform is also alive in the House of Representatives; it is

on the House Republican Caucus' 2010 agenda. The leadership is pushing for passage this session. Meeting with the House leadership, the proponents and the opponents are being held this month with hopes of moving the legislation soon.

It appears that the 2010 session is going to be somewhat different for several reasons: the state, in some people's minds, is broke; the House of Representatives has already scheduled three week furloughs; and the Governor was not impeached.


Undoubtedly, the state's revenues are down and there is little hope that 2010 revenue is going to be any better. The result is going to be further reduced spending, less services and potentially changes in tax laws. Further, I believe the General Assembly is not going to pass legislation that is going to cost the state money.

Fortunately, surveyors are not working on legislation that is going to cost the state more money. However, we will have to watch to be sure registration fees are not raided for the General Fund or sales taxes placed on surveys.

The 2010 legislative session may be the shortest in modern history. Three furloughs have already been announced by the House of Representatives. The Senate may follow suit. Obviously a shortened session gives us less time to pass the bills we want passed.

I mentioned the Governor's impeachment because in the months leading to the opening of the General Assembly, legislators anticipated the impeachment process would consume at least a month of the already shortened session. That time was not lost.

As in any given legislative session, the issues important to surveyors can change, and the ability to get desired legislation passed may change due to opposition, timing and even the leadership.




